# From Kathy Brochu and the Treasurer's desk...

A huge congratulations to everyone in the Women's Club and to all who chaired, worked or attended our fund raising events this year. Because of your support we are able to grant \$30,800 to our 2023 Grant Fund recipients! That is over \$7000 more than we were able to donate in 2022. We are also able to donate a \$2000 scholarship to a PBOC graduating student, as well as provide a \$5000 donation to the PBOC parish. In addition, we have been honored to donate and support the Fresh Xpress, the PBOC parish picnic, the US Army Chorus, the PBOC Golf Tournament, the PBOC Gala, the K of C Military Golf Tournament, the Hope Ball, and The JOY School.

Total Operating Expenses for the 2022-2023 year have been under budget, resulting in a surplus balance which is above the maximum \$2500 we are allotted to carryover. Therefore, this will enable the Board to purchase some items that will benefit the Women's Club for the 2023-2024 year.

Thank you for allowing me to represent the Women's Club as your Treasurer for 2022-2023 and for the upcoming year 2023-2024. Your support has made the job so much easier for me, and I appreciate all of you very much!

#### SPIRITUAL CORNER



As I reflect back on my year as Spiritual Facilitator I recall all the prayerful opportunities that the members are invited to participate in.

We are blessed to be able to gather for several special masses. The Deceased Members mass was on November 29<sup>th</sup>, and we heard the names of the women who have gone before us. We think of the gifts they were to the club and how blessed we are to have such a large number of deceased members praying for our continued success. On January 4<sup>th</sup> we gathered to honor our Patron St. Elizabeth Ann Seton. Such a model of prayer and service and motherhood! We can honor her each day by praying the Prayer to St Elizabeth Ann Seton. Our April Day of Prayer began with Rosary and Mass. Andre again gifted us with music and a cantor to lead us in song. As with our previous masses, the prayer of the faithful and homily were especially pertinent to us.

Where would Lent be without the delicious simple supper and the prayerful Mary's Stations of the Cross? A selection of soups: Tortellini, Tomato, Corn Chowder, Celery and New England Clam Chowder complimented by homemade bread, tuna sandwiches, egg salad sandwiches and pimento sandwiches, egg salad sandwiches and pimento sandwiches filled the bellies of about 60 parishioners. A simple evening to gather and pray and reflect on the Lord's passion and death. We have such talented cooks, bakers and sandwich makers. Thanks to all who made this Friday of Lent so special. Our Day of Prayer was moved from Lent to the Easter season due to conflict with the Parish Mission. Although we did not have the numbers attending as in the past, the 40 women who gathered were led by Sister Pam Smith to reflect on the great gift of the Eucharist. Members participated in praying petitions and reflected on questions and then shared their thoughts with their table's teams. Many then shared with the whole group. After lunch and writing individual prayer petitions we walked over to Church for a time of Adoration before the Blessed Sacrament. One takeaway was the guide "An Honor of Adoration with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament".

The Women's Club continues to lead the 3pm first Friday Chaplet of Divine Mercy. On average about 7 members attending. We also gather to pray the Chaplet at 3pm during the Fridays of Lent and Advent. This is a simple prayer and speaks to the mercy of God. Join us for 10-20 minutes to pray the Chaplet and stay longer for some quiet time with the Blessed Sacrament.

The last fruitful activity is the prayer partner program. Each month members write heartfelt petitions (anonymously or signed) and drop them in the basket. As members leave, they take one and pray for that person and their need every day until the next meeting. It was a slow start but has caught on. Holding each other up in prayer only makes us stronger as Catholic Christian women.

Each of these opportunities rely on member volunteers to assist in planning and implementation. As usual, many members step up to help. My thanks to each and every one of you whether you pitched in at the last moment or helped me from day one of an event. There are too many generous and helpful members to name. But I especially thank Christine Schwartz and Jessica Senese for all their help.
